Athletic Career & Olympic Highlights

- **Malian–French basketball player** born on 11 June 1978 in Bamako, Mali
- Stood at 178 cm (5'10") and played professionally in Europe (Austria, Spain, France), where she won multiple titles, including **five French national junior championships**
- Represented Mali as **co-captain at the 2008 Beijing Olympics**, following the team's victory at the 2007 FIBA Africa Championship for Women
- At Beijing, she helped lead Mali to its first Olympic appearance, playing in five games and averaging approximately 0.8 points and 2.4 rebounds per match

- Earned a **Bachelor's degree in Marketing and Management** from **Fordham University**, New York
- Post-athletic career, she transitioned into mentorship, education, and advocacy within international sports organizations.

Leadership & Advocacy Roles

- **President, Zone 2 Athletes' Commission** of the Association of National Olympic Committees of Africa (ANOCA) since 2013, representing seven Central and West African nations.
- **Master Trainer** and Steering Committee member for the **IOC Athlete Career+ Programme**, delivering workshops across 35–50 countries.
- Chair of the **WADA Education Committee**, promoting clean sport through global outreach and independent observation at events like PyeongChang 2018 Winter Olympics.
- Active advocate for women's leadership and athletes' representation—encouraging female engagement in sports administration and decision-making.

Works on sustainability, disability inclusion, energy access, and community empowerment—leveraging her sport values in social enterprise.
